

I have used this for an advanced community college ESOL class that focuses on writing a research paper. The first half the book has helpful exercises that require students to evaluate and revise thesis statements, evidence to support points, and so on. Unfortunately these exercises are tied to the readings in the second part of the book, which are not especially well chosen or well-written. The main reason I no longer use the book is that it teaches APA format while the college-transfer English class that my students are preparing to take will require them to use MLA.

Okay book for what it is, but some of the sample articles in the second part are quite out of date. Yes, there's some relevance, but students could probably pull up equivalent articles from Google and be more current. Additionally, many of the sample articles aren't as scholarly as they could be--Wall Street Journal, New York Times, and other periodicals aren't going to get students ready for the real world. The worst part is the price. Nat Geo/Cengage should be ashamed of themselves.
