

This is a heartwarming story of an adolescent entering foster care for the first time after abuse from a stepfather. She discovers how a functional family operates. With this discovery comes anger towards her own mother, a desire to be a real part of her foster family, and feelings that she is unworthy of happiness. As a foster parent, I have seen this scenario played out in real life many times and know that it is realistic. I enjoyed the bittersweet ending!

"One For The Murphys is a very touching tale about a street-smart Vegas girl named Carley who is forced into foster care after an incident at her home in Connecticut. After moving in with her foster

family, the Murphys, she immediately wants to return to her real mother in physical therapy. However, as Carley warms up to the Murphys, she gets a taste of what has been missing from her life for a long time. When her real mother is well enough and wants her back, Carley must make the heart-wrenching decision on who she wants to live with. This book is very realistic and well-worded. It clearly describes the very stressful and confusing life of Carley at her foster home. Emotional and eye-opening, Lynda Hunt creates wonderful characters, a believable plot, and emotional scenes filled to the brim with detail. I recommend this book to absolutely any reader looking for a good story.

My daughter (11) loved this book because she can now relate to how an abused child feels. Despite being abused and betrayed by her mother and the string of her mother's boyfriends/husbands, Carly is a very caring and sometimes stubborn and obnoxious (like a typical tween/teen) person who regained some trust in people under the loving care of her foster mother and family. My daughter felt sorry Carly because Carly was torn between feeling loyal to her foster family and feeling loyal to her mother who put her in this situation in the first place.

I loved this book. It was so touching and true, the fact that this is realistic fiction and it can actually happen makes me love it even more!!! I wish, SO MUCH, that Carley could have stayed with the Murphys, and maybe get mom actually didn't want her back. I really didn't want to finish this book because now I don't know what I'm going to read!

A realistic accounting of the struggles for a young teen to understand and adapt to a functional loving family when all she has known is her dysfunctional one. Lessons to be learned by all are available without a preaching tone, but with heart and the importance of love and understanding.

My 8th grade daughter and I read this book, and we both loved it. It made us laugh and cry. It taught us more about the life a foster child might experience. It made if feel as though our own family was fairly normal. At the end of the book, you weren't sure who to root for, and what decision you hoped the main character would make. Is blood thicker than water? Without spoiling the ending, just know that it was happy and uplifting.

Good story for 11 - 14 year olds. Enjoyed it very much, but as an adult, would have liked to delve deeper into the character's pasts. Just the right amount of detail for young teens without becoming too explicit.

My 13 year old read this book this summer. It was one of 12 books on her summer reading list and she said this was her favorite out of the 12.
