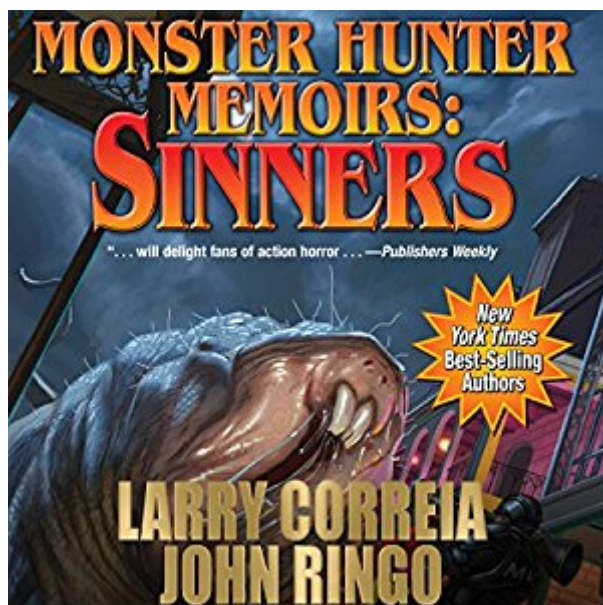


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Monster Hunter Memoirs: Sinners



Synopsis

A new novel in the Monster Hunter Memoirs series. Two authors, who combined have over four million books in print and 10 New York Times best sellers, team up to expand Larry Correia's Monster Hunter universe! With half a dozen or more loup garou appearing every full moon, mysterious shadow demons, hoodoun necromancers, 50-foot bipedal crocodiles showing up every couple of months, and more vampires than a Goth concert, New Orleans in the '80s gives a whole new perspective to the term hell on earth. In fact more monsters are popping up than crawfish at a fais do do! Chad may be able to collect enormous bounties for the monsters he kills. But there's one catch: He has to stay alive to do it!

Great MHI book! John Ringo gets to bring his great style to Larry Correia's universe. This "side series" of MHI is kind of the best of both worlds: Ringo's powerful writing combined with Correia's equally powerful writing AND his excellent world building. I love John Ringo, but he has a tendency to peter out near the end of series that started off rock solid (Troy Rising/The Hot Gate is a great example...) -- writing in Larry Correia's world gives Ringo some structure and lets him do what he does best: write great military themed SF/Fantasy. Highly recommended, just this series (MHI: Grunge, MHI: Sinners, and the 3rd one) after all the regular MHI books, as they may contain some spoilers (although the authors are very good at trying not to.)

I love the Monster Hunter series. While the "memiors" books are written by John Ringo and only edited by Larry Correia they are still on par with the books in the main story line and are extremely enjoyable. This is the kind of fiction I enjoy so I like the writing. As the name implies, they hunt monsters so there's no end to the swords, guns, and explosives used to dispatch the other-worldly. The main character is a bit of a womanizer and there is implied sexual content, but nothing graphic. I would say this book is probably best for readers in the 16+ range since there is some mature content. That said, my nephews have been reading the monster hunter books since the youngest was around 13.

Once again Larry & John deliver an awesomely fantastic story. Continuing the adventures of Chad Gardner..first introduced in MONSTER HUNTER GRUNGE...this time set in New Orleans after Chad's run in with an underage (for an Elf) princess and her vengeful mullet headed red neck brothers. Discovering a different world compared to the rest of the country...where the Hoodoo Squad are not only well know..but treated with respect by even the MCB.Being dumped into the grinder on a full moon..Chad soon discovers why there is a high turn around in the Big Easy.Lots of fun and hard to put down. All fans of MHI will be remissed to not read this one.

I love this series and this book had lots of the elements that I love. Interesting monsters, innovative ways to get rid of monsters, local flavor, etc. still, this book did not seem as polished as the last. It seemed to me that the author was trying to fill space in places with extraneous and often just plain ridiculous explanations and he has gone way overboard on over explaining to the readers how smart Hand really is.

I'm a huge fan of the Monster Hunter universe, but this entry is one of the weakest of the series. In this second installment with the main character, he has not become any more likable. The fact he is a womanizing jerk is actually the least objectionable part of the story. The real problem is he is a jackass who is also a classic Mary-sue. He is amazing at everything he does, but with no real depth whatsoever. He is also an arrogant prick who is somehow super popular. Where the MH novels have gotten better over the years in almost every way, this one feels like a step backward.

The Ringo/Correia collaboration on the early(ish) history of Monster Hunters International continues in sweltering New Orleans, where mysterious forces are causing a monster plague...Good fun, but the story is clearly not over for the protagonists.

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
