

Garrouette outlines the trouble and strife of being a full blooded Indian, detailing the struggles of acceptance and the different forms of classifications Indian tribes have installed in order to gain access to tribal benefits and pensions. The book reads more like an encyclopedia of tragic disregard for Indians meddling in the blurr of tribal recognition. Both the Federal Government as well as the tribes play significant rolls. From the Dawes act of 1887 clear into modern times, many tribes still consider a blood quantum and direct decent from a full blooded relative the only form true Indian identification. This has caused a racial backlash and an inability for tribal societies to expand

beyond their own cult like existence, denying recognition to those who've married and mingled outside the full blood requirements. Overall, this book is extremely informative, but void of excitement.
