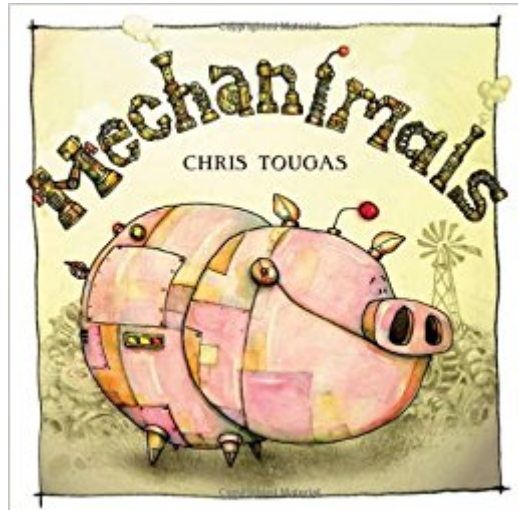

There is an old saying that sums up things pretty well, "When life gives you lemons, make lemonade." In the case of one particular old farmer, when life gave him a big, windy and horrible tornado that swept everything away, he made mechanimals. When a twister blows through a small farm community it leaves a humongous mess of scrap metal and dust. But, this little farmer is determined to make a master piece out of the left over mess. His neighbors didn't have a lot of faith in him. Their comment was, "when pigs fly." That didn't stop the farmer. He got busy getting organized and drawing up plans. His first creation from that heap was a robot rooster so he wouldn't sleep in. Then he made chick-bots, cow-bots, horse-bot and sheep-bots too. The farmers creations helped him put his farm back together. But there was one last creation he needed to make just so he could show-off to his neighbors. Can you guess what it is? Tougas is a genius. This one of a kind

story is truly fun and imaginative. Robot animals are cute and quirky. The illustrations will have young readers believing these little critters really exist. Simple short sentences make learning to read easy. The pictures will have little readers eager to tell their own version of the story.

This book has wonderful illustrations and a good message of "When things go badly, think out of the box and figure out how to get back on top." That is exactly what the farmer did when a tornado swept through and took everything while leaving behind a pile of scraps. The farmer used those scraps to rebuild his life. Kids will love the quirky mechanical animals. My only negative comments are: 1) about the illustrations. The author uses a scratching style perhaps to age the picture. It causes the pictures to not be as clear as they could be for young eyes. Otherwise they are beautiful. and 2) The story is a little bit flat. The author has a fun and humorous style. I would have liked more story.

"Mechanimals" is delightful! It's so much fun to watch the farmer's new bots take shape. Chris Tougas' illustrations are brilliantly stylized and bring a smile to the face. Simple text tells just enough and leaves the rest to play out on the page and in the imagination. First published in 2007, the paperback edition is a welcome and inexpensive discovery. Children and adults will love visiting this barnyard.
