

This book will not teach you how to skydive. Pretty much all of the material covered here is available for free on the internet with a little effort. But the author has an entertaining and easy to read style that make this book an enjoyable way to spend an hour or so learning a little bit about skydiving - why people do it and what it takes to learn to do it yourself. For me, the promise in the title of a

glimpse into the culture of modern skydiving was not fulfilled. When the book ended, I wanted more. What happens when skydivers aren't jumping is as much or more important as what happens in the sky. A few questions that I wish the author had explored - What makes skydivers hang out at the dropzone on obvious bad weather days? Why do they spend thousands of dollars to travel thousands of miles to camp next to an asphalt strip for a week? And if we're going to be politically incorrect, how can a woman get extra altitude for the whole load? What's a safety meeting? And who fills the beer fridge? Overall, this book is well written and a fast read. If you know nothing about skydiving, you'll learn a lot, find some resources for further information and have some laughs. If you are already a skydiver, there's not much new or special here for you.

Well done. I'm an old rock climber that took up this sport recently. Dealing with the ups and downs of high adventure sports, and becoming an adventurer with eyes wide open is what life is about. Buy the book if you want to undertake any sport beyond the ultra-safe. Good writer. Covers the emotion of jumping out of an airplane, or jumping out of a mundane, modern self-medicated life. Read, jump, climb, and know that there are some f...ing great people out there living life.
