

I knew I was in trouble on page V of the introduction, when the author described his methodology for selecting things for the book as: "We cull, interview, visit and delve deeply to find both the gay and mainstream establishments we feel fit well with sophisticated queer sensibility, with an emphasis on the luxurious, the classy, or at least the truly unique". "Sophisticated queer sensibility"? What in blazes is that? And for the vast majority of us gay folk who aren't or can't afford "luxurious or classy", what are we to do with this book? It was confirmed that I was headed down the wrong road with this book when the author wrote about his friendships with porn stars in Fort Lauderdale, and how condoms and sleeveless shirts are mandatory things for gay men to bring to Florida. Well, perhaps if you're a sex-obsessed circuit queen, but for those of us who are older, settled and want a decent nice vacation, the book is virtually useless - as the author's statements I mention above make his choices of restaurants, bars and attractions all suspect. I deeply regret purchasing this book, and won't buy any others either in this series or by this author.

A specialized travel book for visitors to South Florida, whether for business or pleasure, "The Out Traveler: South Florida" compiled and written by Paul Rubio includes the Florida Keys, Orlando, and the Tampa Bay Area, as well such major destination areas as Miami, Fort Lauderdale, Palm Beach, and St. Petersburg.
