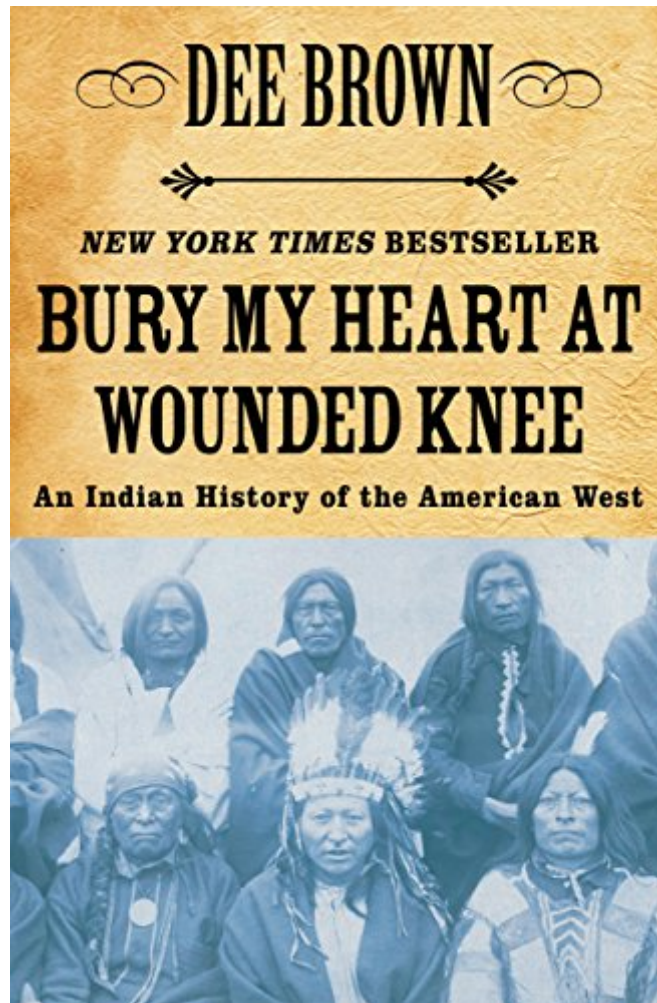




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Bury My Heart At Wounded Knee: An Indian History Of The American West
